COMMITTEE AND STAFF REPORTS

<u>Municipal Enforcement Officer's Report:</u>

Utilities:

Several calls have been received from Hamlet residents concerned about possible water main leaks.

Staff has investigated most of the calls and believe the cause of basement seepage is related to the unusually high ground water table.

- Minor programming of the Manyberries control panel has been made to accommodate upgrades in the SCADA System.
- The Manyberries and Etzikom Systems are reporting an alarming chlorine concentrations remotely and resetting automatically. The County is no longer utilizing hamlet residents for monitoring the systems. Staff is, however, monitoring the sites as per Alberta Environment requirements.

Protective Services Co-ordinator's Report

Fire:

- Quotes were obtained for the purchase of SCBA's under the Municipal Sponsorship Program.
- Information has been obtained regarding Critical Incident Stress Management Training to assist in recognizing the symptoms for County volunteer members. There also has been some discussion on the County's Protective Services Coordinator joining the Critical Incident Stress Management Team in the future.

Safety:

- General maintenance continues with the County's Safety Program
- Hazard assessments are ongoing
- New staff orientation is ongoing

Disaster:

 Attended a seminar in June, 2010 on the Milenet Program to assist in posting the County's Municipal Emergency Plan. This will also improve the communications with Alberta Emergency Management Agency.

Burdett Utility Officer's Report

- A new online turbidity meter has been installed at Burdett. The unit is a stand-alone unit that would allow it to be moved into the pump house and monitor turbidity leaving the pump house once the plant is decommissioned.
- The Burdett Reservoirs will be filled as soon as the water quality improves. There is presently a lot of water remaining in the north reservoir.
- The Burdett Sewage Lagoon was pumped for twenty four hours until the landowner shut his irrigation system down due to the excessive amount of moisture received.
- A lot of complaints have been received regarding the excessive moisture and water seepage in the basements.

The Municipal Supervisor was requested to have a look at the road situation in the Hamlet of Winnifred and to take the appropriate action to address the issues expressed by Councillor Gross.

Mr. Gross also advised that he had received a request to have the lots, that were recently sold, marked.

The Municipal Supervisor advised that Midwest Surveys has recently pinned the blocks and, therefore, the landowner should be able to measure from those points to determine their lots.

<u>Hamlet – Weed Issues</u>

Councillor Ronald Harty inquired to see what action could be taken to address the dandelion issue in the various hamlets.

Grader Operators are getting the roads back in shape for the second time after the recent moisture. Some areas stood up well considering the amount of moisture we received.

The Oiling Crew has been applying road stabilizers on projects south of Bow Island.

Yellow Lake is the highest it has been in several years causing some washing of shoulders on the east west crossing west of the Burdett road on Township Road 100. St. Mary River Irrigation District has had two units pumping water out the past week.

The County has received approval from Alberta Environment to pump down the wetland in Burdett, and we should have the main line placed and begin pumping the second week of June.

Medicine Hat Fire Dispatch Service

Medicine Hat Regional 911 Communications has advised that there will be a change in their fee schedule for fire dispatch services.

Effective January 1, 2011 the service will increase from 1.28 per capita to \$1.34 per capita.
